I have an extensive background in Chinese martial arts from a personal and professional perspective and currently practice and teach Kung-Fu and Tai Chi on a weekly basis.

In addition to a full-time day job, I hold several national, continental and international Chinese martial arts positions.

My skill set enables me to look at the promotion and development of Chinese martial arts (Wushu) from a political, strategic, operational, cultural and philosophical viewpoint.

I believe Wushu is approaching a new era of growth and development, and now more than ever needs strong vision and leadership to become a truly global mainstream sport.

My background as an accomplished national and continental president and international vice president, provides me with the depth of skills, knowledge and experience needed to **lead Wushu into this new era and realise its dream of becoming an Olympic sport.**

-  I have extensive experience working in central government and private sector organisations at a senior management level and can relate to officials at all levels of enterprise.
-  I currently work as a General Manager Strategic Engagement for a New Zealand government funded Tertiary Education Organisation
-  I practice Chinese martial arts on a daily basis and have trained for over 42 years in traditional Kung-Fu and Tai Chi under the guidance of reputable masters
-  I have over 24 years involvement with the International Wushu Federation, with 15 years as an Executive Member and 11 years as a Vice President. I was also appointed as Chairman of IWUF's first Anti-Doping Disciplinary Committee
-  I have over 24 years of successful promotion and development of Wushu in New Zealand, as President of the New Zealand Kung-Fu Wushu Federation, the only government recognised National Wushu Federation in New Zealand
-  I have over 16 years of successful promotion and development of Wushu in the continent of Oceania, as President of the Oceania Wushu Federation, the sole recognised body by the International Wushu Federation
-  I have received recognition from my peers with having been nominated and inducted into the New Zealand (2000) and Australasian (2006) Martial Arts Halls of Fame, and into the World Karate Union Hall of Fame (2006)

1997	I became the Chief Instructor for Traditional Yang Style Tai Chi after several years study under Master Phillip Kwong from Hong Kong China
2000	I was inducted into the New Zealand Martial Arts Hall of Fame

2006	I was inducted into the Australasian Martial Arts Hall of Fame, and World Karate Union Hall of Fame, and received an award for 'Kung-Fu Instructor of the Year' from both
