Topic: New Websites

Topic: NZKWF AGM 2010

The NZKWF 2010 AGM was held on 21st November at the Johnsonville Community Centre in Wellington. See AGM 2011 for full documentation.

Key Meeting Outcomes:

- Leslie Kentfield voted as the replacement Executive Member for Raymond Poy who retired from the role earlier in the year.
- Approval of a new 'Cultural' membership category and new role of 'Cultural Ambassador' on the Executive Committee.
- Introduction of Active and Passive membership status.
- Renaming of some membership categories.
- Reduction of membership fees for 2011.
- Agreement to partner with the NZ National Tai Chi Chuan Association in co-coordinating the Wellington 'World Tai Chi and Qi-Gong Day' celebrations for 2011.
- All Federation Judges, Coaches and Officials are required to be NZKWF members in their own right.

Topic: Wushu Scholarship Proposal

Glen Keith had positive discussions with the Chinese Wushu Association President Mr Gao Xiaojun regarding the CWA funding an annual NZKWF Wushu Scholarship for 1 taolu athlete and/or 1 sanda athlete.

The scholarship would see the athlete training at an exclusive Wushu Academy in China for up to 3 weeks, with the cost of tuition, accommodation, food and transportation covered by the CWA.

Participants however will have to pay for their own international travel. Parents and families will have the option of accompanying at their own cost. The criteria to be considered for this prestigious scholarship will be advised in due course. The Federation is waiting on written confirmation from CWA.

New Membership Category - Cultural Member

Members at the AGM ratified a new membership category called 'Cultural Member', which is open to any group or organisation involved in the promotion of Chinese culture through activities such as Lion, Dragon or Kung-Fu dance or through traditional Chinese medicine and healing arts such as Acupuncture, Acupressure, Qi-Gong and Herbal Medicine. All members are covered and no voting rights. As a point of clarification, a person teaching Qi-Gong as part of a Chinese martial arts club should still apply for Constituent membership.

New Executive Team Position - Cultural Ambassador

To help promote membership and participation in our events from Chinese cultural performance and other groups, the Federation Executive has agreed a new position in the Executive Team called 'Cultural Ambassador'. The new role will have a wide brief including overseeing cultural protocols in Federation activity. A Job Description will be developed and members will be given the opportunity to express an interest. The position will be appointed by the Federation Executive Management Team.



While in Beijing in September 2010, Glen Keith was successful in acquiring sponsorship to cover the full cost of a Sanda Lei-Tai Fighting Platform and Traditional Wushu Taolu Carpet, which have a combined value of USD56,180 [NZD73,351]. He also made a successful application to the New Zealand Community Trust (NZCT) who approved \$5,000 for freight costs from China. All that is left is to find a way to securely store the items. Topic: Schools Wushu Programme

The focus of the Federation's Investment Proposal to SPARC in October 2010 was based on the introduction of wushu into New Zealand primary and secondary schools, while at the same time targeting school leavers.

The proposal was ambitious and signaled a significant change-path for the Federation - one that overtime will build a solid foundation for New Zealand's future junior wushu athletes, as well as create sport and recreation opportunities for all New Zealanders.

Glen Keith met with SPARC officials to discuss the Programme and while feedback was promising, he was advised that "SPARCs current budget / business case for Community Sport Investment for smaller NSOs is currently at the maximum level."

SPARC was supportive of NZKWF piloting the Schools Wushu Programme and suggested that "*in this case there would be better investment/funding avenues to investigate for the sort of investment you are after to target delivery and development to young people - Kiwisport through Regional Sports Trusts being one such option*".

Glen Keith has made contact with Sport Wellington's 'Sport Development Manager' and 'Kiwi Sport Manager' and will set up a meeting in March to discuss a possible pilot programme in Wellington and/or Auckland.

The Federation hopes that SPARC, Kiwi Sport and the Ministry of Education will see great benefit in the introduction of a 'Schools Wushu Programme'.

Topic: Wushu Coaching Curriculum

Discussions have begun on a framework for a National Wushu Coaching Curriculum, starting with IWUF Sport Taolu and Sanda. Several key routines will be selected to trial the curriculum, beginning with modern Taolu (Forms) routines of Chang Quan (Long-fist), Nan Quan (Southern-fist), Taiji Quan (Shadow boxing). The curriculum will also include Sanda (Fighting).

The Taolu and Sanda curriculums will encompass elementary, intermediate and advanced levels, and where possible, will be aligned to the Chinese Duan Grading System, to enable robust competency assessment of students.

The Taolu curriculum will also include development of 'Structured Fundamental Movement' and 'Basic Wushu Skills' for use in target primary schools as part of the Schools Wushu Programme.

The Federation will also look to develop structured beginner and intermediate level wushu classes in target secondary schools, as part of the Programme.

Identifying available and suitable wushu coaches however may present a challenge, so please contact Glen Keith if you think you can assist.

APPENDIX 4 - Wushu Events 2010 - A Look Back...

4th World Traditional Wushu Championships 2010

The Championships were held October 16 to 20, 2010 in Shiyan City near the Wudang Taoist spiritual mountain. Dave Thew and Vitali Muhin represented New Zealand with Grant Butcher as the New Zealand Team Leader/Manager. More than 2000 athletes from 83 countries and regions participated in the event, the largest to date. Congratulations to Dave and Vitali for an excellent performance. See **Appendix 2** for results.

1st Australasian Wushu Championships 2010

The Australasian event was hosted by the Australian Kung-Fu Wushu Federation on 24 October 2010 in Home Bush - the Sydney Olympic Games site. The team from New Zealand included [for Taolu], Dave Thew, David Wong, Dianna Lau, Mercedes Godinez, Harris Thien and [for Sanda], Deja Finn. Congratulations to the team for an all-round excellent performance. See **Appendix 3** for results.

1st World Combat Games 2010

The1st SportAccord World Combat Games <u>www.beijing2010.org</u> hosted by the Beijing City between 28 Aug 2010 and 4 Sep 2010 was a resounding success. The Combat Games, nick-named the "Martial Arts Olympics", were organised by SportAccord for around USD10m. Jet Li and Jacky Chan were among high profile sport ambassadors at the opening ceremony. NZKWF President Glen Keith attended in his role as Vice President of the International Wushu Federation. While there Glen met with Karate New Zealand and New Zealand Muay Thai members at the event.

[New Zealand Combat Games] Glen Keith on behalf of the NZKWF Executive wrote to other SPARC recognised Martial Arts National Sport Organisations back in February 2010 to discuss the possibility of working collaboratively to host a similar but smaller event in New Zealand. The NZKWF has secured the website domain <u>www.combatgames.org.nz</u> in anticipation of future developments in this area.

3rd Junior World Wushu Championships 2010

New Zealand was represented at the 1st Junior World Wushu Championships in Kuala Lumpur in 2006, which saw Tony Mazur from the Kapiti Kempo Club winning a bronze medal in sanda. While several athletes expressed interest in the 2010 event in Singapore, none meet all the required selection criteria. The NZKWF would like to see this event become a key destination for New Zealand's up-and-coming elite junior wushu athletes. Several junior wushu athletes have been identified for the NZKWF Junior Development Squad, and we are hopeful we'll seem them compete in the Junior Worlds next year!

Chinese Wushu Association (Elite Wushu Athletes) New Zealand 2010

Held on Sunday 23 May 2010 in the Wellington Town Hall, the show was a visually spectacular and immensely entertaining showcase of modern and traditional Wushu at its highest level, for the 1,100 who attended the event. The first half of the show featured some very talented local cultural and wushu groups, with the Chinese Wushu athletes performing in the 2nd half. VIPs included His Excellency Ambassador Zhang Limin of the Embassy of the People's Republic of China, Honourable Pansy Wong, the Minister of Ethnic Affairs and Mr Gao Xiaojun, President of the Chinese Wushu Association.

Wellington Wushu Friendship Festival-World Tai Chi Day Celebration

The 2010 Wellington Wushu Friendship Festival doubled as our World Tai Chi Day Celebration and involved an exciting line-up of performances at the Chinese Anglican Centre in Wellington. Thanks to Ferne McKenzie and Ray Poy for promoting the event. The NZKWF will discuss whether to adopt the same format for future years.

Auckland Wushu Friendship Festival and Sanda Judges Course

The Auckland Wushu Friendship Festival was held at the Auckland Chinese Community Centre Mangere. A very successful event building on the inaugural event held in Auckland in 2009. Special thanks to Dianna Lau and David Wong for their support. The Sanda Judges Course held at the same location was also very successful with an excellent workshop run by Grant Butcher.
